## Just-in-Time Biosafety Review Grant Application Signature Page

Many federal agencies will accept the Just-in-Time Institutional Biosafety Committee (IBC) Review. The sponsor's instructions should stipulate if IBC approval or pending approval is required at the time of proposal submission, or the sponsor acknowledges acceptance of Just-in-Time IBC Review.

NOTE: By signing this statement the investigator acknowledges that all biosafety requirements will be secured before initiation of the proposed project. All investigators utilizing this type of review process are required to submit this signed statement with the university transmittal sheet indicating submission of a grant application to the respective agency prior to receiving approval from the Institutional Biosafety Committee (IBC) for a project involving infectious materials and/or recombinant DNA.

Many agencies provide a short window between the notice of funding and the start date. This window may be too short for normal IBC procedures to process the application. If you believe this is true for the agency to which you applied, you may submit a new protocol form to the IBC prior to the notice of funding in order to avoid delays in the start date.

No portion of the proposed research can be conducted until the registration form(s) has been reviewed and approved by the IBC and funds will not be released until final approval has been received.
